 - Short, simple, readable, usable, we need people to respond, get feedback from where they are; can’t have massive survey with too many questions
- **Stakeholder Engagements:** Target stakeholder meetings to be held by July 13 BerryDunn to schedule meetings that week- virtually or onsite.

 - **PROST-** Might be our agenda for July 13 meeting. Want it to be this group in person
 - **Additional Visibility:**

- **Town Hall** on July 15 (tentative) to get engagement, discuss Master Plan, Water, etc., **Pop Up Events**- 4th of July, were at Brewfest; **Rec Trailer**- use as a dry erase/chalk board for ideas “Tell us your vision in 10 words or less” “Draw a picture”; **4th of July- Float?** Larimer Sheriffs? Sarah- Zach Wartenbee- CSO for schools- may be willing to promote for the Town in 4th; **Promotion of Surveys through Rec communication**- TeamSnap, Email comms to all; **Mingle on Main**- Pride- June 20th; **Farmer’s Markets**- internal conversation; **Movies at the Park**; **Park engagement**- will put QR code Splash Pad, Pickleball courts, shelters, kiosks at baseball fields,
