Wellington Town Updates - Connecting Our Community, Building Our Future

Summer Reading Program Update

The re-design and additions to the Summer Reading Program (SRP) have been very well received. We've increased access to event programming with the introduction of the three-series DMNS STEM classes, aimed at youth to young adults. New additions for July are highly anticipated and appreciated by our patrons and residents.

Finance Department News

- **2025 Budget Calendar Released**: We are officially in budget season.
- **2022 Audit**: The audit is still in process with our auditor.
- **Enhanced Security Measures**: We've installed security cameras, a new depository vault, and upgraded our cash safes at MSB.
- **Finance Committee Meeting**: This month's worksession will include a review of cash handling and purchasing policies. The Finance Committee still has openings! Interested residents can apply on the Town's website.

Planning Department Updates

• Planner I-III Position: Interviews are being conducted to fill a vacant position.

- Affordable Housing Needs Assessment: A consultant has been selected to assist in conducting
 this assessment and strategy development. Staff is excited to work on the project schedule and
 public engagement events.
- Downtown Property Renovations: Planning staff is coordinating with multiple new property owners on Cleveland Ave. Owners are showing interest in renovating existing buildings and attracting new businesses.
- Business Transitions: Staff assisted with ownership changes and property reinvestments for Big
 D Oil/Sinclair (formerly Shell) and Maverick (formerly Kum & Go).

Infrastructure and Development

- New Water Treatment Plant: The plant has successfully started up and is producing water for distribution.
- Water Reclamation Facility: The facility has begun its first stages of start-up, which will continue for about another 2 months.
- **Box Elder Creek LOMR**: The Letter of Map Amendment has been approved by FEMA and is currently in the standard appeal period.
- Cleveland Avenue Improvements: The project is mid-way through the 30% design phase.
